Andreas Angelidakis, *DEMOS - A Reconstruction* September 22, 2018–August 2019

Functional and interactive, MOCA's first large-scale Invitation Project invites visitors to reconfigure 74 modular foam blocks. The work is located on Floor 1 and free to all. It can serve as seating, a stage, an amphitheatre or even sculptural monuments.

Chantal Akerman, NOW and In the Mirror

February 14, 2019 to April 21, 2019

This is the first presentation in Canada of Akerman's final video installation *NOW*, which was originally produced for the Venice Biennale in 2015. This immersive experience — a mediation on the power, meaning and mystery of time is coupled with her much earlier and very personal work *In the Mirror* that dates back to 1971.

Mark Dion

May 22, 2019-July 2019

The first Sterling Commission will see a major new work produced for MOCA by artist Mark Dion that responds to the context of Toronto and the centenary of the Tower Automotive Building that is MOCA's home.

Shezad Dawood, Leviathan

September–November 2019

Part of an ambitious ten-part film cycle inaugurated at the 57th Art Biennale in Venice, this ascending artist series installment will address marine welfare, migration, mental health and interconnections. *Leviathan: Episode 5* has been co-commissioned by Tale of a Tub, Rotterdam, and a Canadian partnership between Fogo Island Arts, Museum of Contemporary Art Toronto, and Toronto Biennial of Art.

Age of You

September 2019-January 2020

MOCA's second group exhibition is organized by Shumon Basar, Douglas Coupland and Hans Ulrich Obrist and will focus on ideas of subjectivity while elaborating on the question, "Who are you?"
